**Course Objectives:** Topics specifically chosen to meet the needs of the student of economics: the definite integral, functions of several variables, partial derivatives, Lagrange multipliers, and matrices.

**Duplicate Credit:** Not open to students with credit in MATH 2110E, MATH 2260, MATH 2310H, MATH 2410H.

**Prerequisite:** MATH 2200 or MATH 2250.

**Grading Policy:** There will be four tests and one cumulative final. Homework will be assigned regularly on WebWork. Quizzes will be given at the beginning of class every Friday.

**Tests and Final Exam:** I do not drop any test scores, nor do I allow your final exam to replace your lowest test score.

Notice that there is a "Test+" that accounts for 5% of your grade. This five percent will be allotted to your highest test/exam score. For example, scoring a 78, 94, 64, 83, and a 91 on your final will give you a 94 for your "Test+" column. Similarly, scores of 60, 65, 68, 72, with an 89 on your final will give you an 89 for your "Test+" score.
